SCHOOL BACKGROUND AND MISSION

Westover is an independent college preparatory boarding and day school for young women in grades 9 - 12. Founded in 1909, Westover is located halfway between New York City and Boston. Westover empowers young women to lead lives of consequence.

Due to challenges created by the COVID-19 pandemic, in the third trimester of the 2019-2020 school year, Westover graded on a Pass/Fail scale. Spring trimester courses count toward total credits earned but are not factored into the cumulative GPA

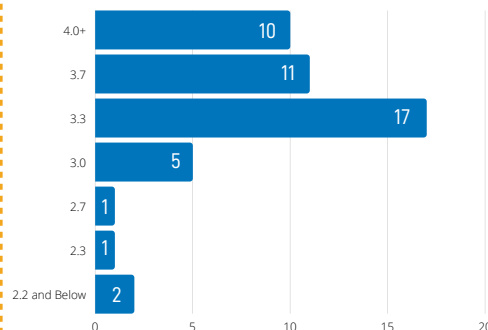
